Scientific Excursion on Sat, 5 September 2009

The excursion will take you to the top of Schneeberg mountain and will include root excavations of the typical vegetation for the region.

Schneeberg with its 2076 m high summit *Klosterwappen*, is the highest mountain of Lower Austria in the south of Vienna (90km). It is a distinctive limestone massif with steep slopes on three sides. It and the Rax (2007 m), some 13 km to the south-west, are collectively considered the Viennese *Hausberge* (local mountains). The rich Karst plateaux have provided drinking water for Vienna, via a 120 km long pipeline, since 1873, claiming to be the best drinking water in the world.
